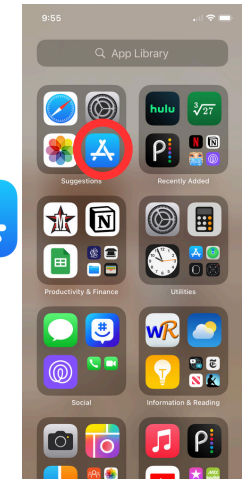

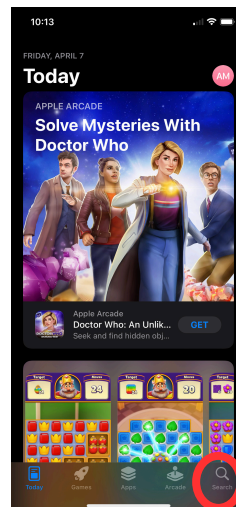
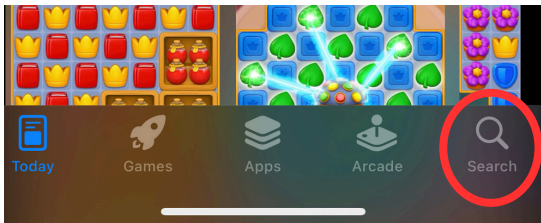
How to Install Applications on your iPhone:

1. Swipe right on your iPhone screen until you reach the App Library screen.
2. Tap on the blue App Store icon on the home screen or search “App Store” in the top search bar, and click the resulting icon.



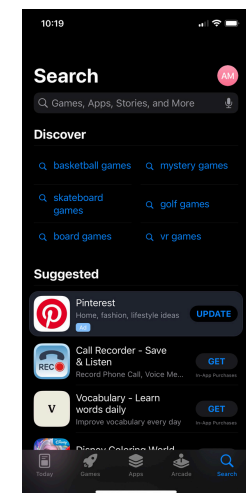
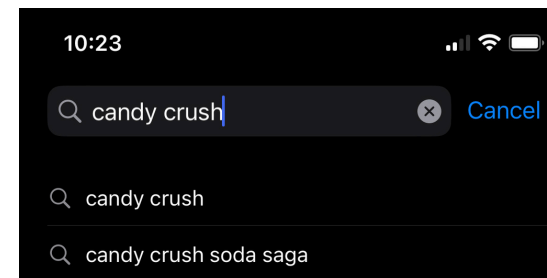
How to Install Applications on your iPhone:

3. Click the magnifying glass search icon in the bottom right corner of the screen.



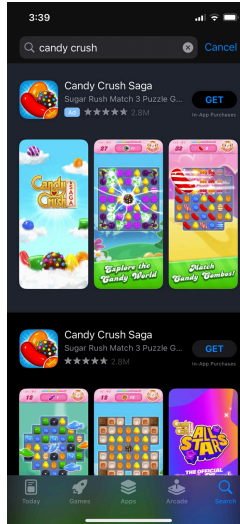
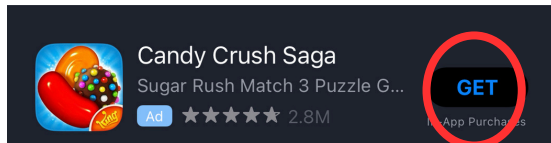
How to Install Applications on your iPhone:

4. Tap the blank search bar and enter the name of the app you are looking for.



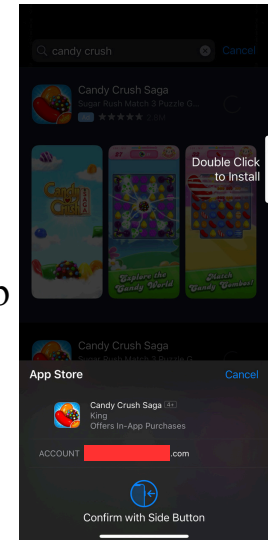
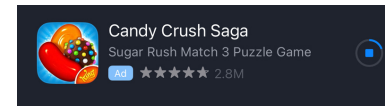
How to Install Applications on your iPhone:

5. Scroll through the search results until you see the app you are looking for.
6. Click the "GET" button next to the app name. If the app is free, this button will say get, but if it costs money, it will say buy. If you have owned the app in the past it will show a cloud icon here.



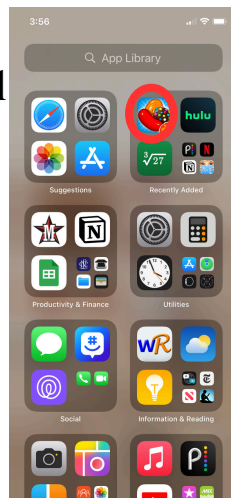
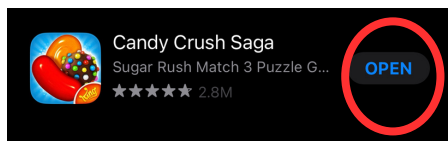
How to Install Applications on your iPhone:

7. After you click "GET," you will be prompted for your Face ID or your Apple ID password to complete the installation.
8. After you enter your Apple ID password or complete Face ID, the app will begin to download, displaying a filling circle icon.



How to Install Applications on your iPhone:

8. When your app has finished downloaded, the "OPEN" button will be displayed next to the app name. Click this to open your new app or search it in your home screen App Library as directed in Steps 1 and 2.



Navigating Settings on your iPhone:

Connecting to Wifi

Connecting to wifi on your phone will help you to execute functions, such as sending and receiving messages and files at a faster speed. Plus, if you have a limited cellular data plan, using wifi will help you to save cellular data.

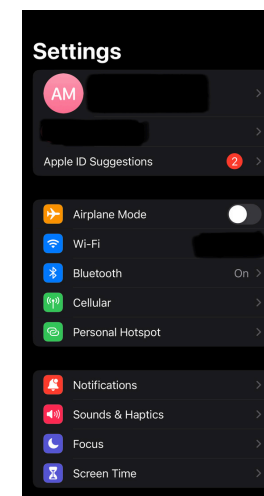
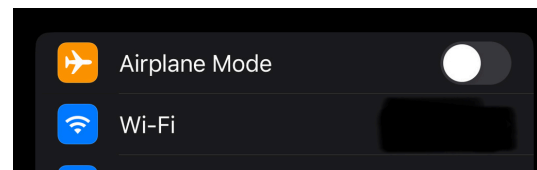
1. Swipe right on your iPhone screen until you reach the App Library screen.
2. Tap on the gray Settings icon on the home screen or search "Settings" in the top search bar, and click the resulting icon.

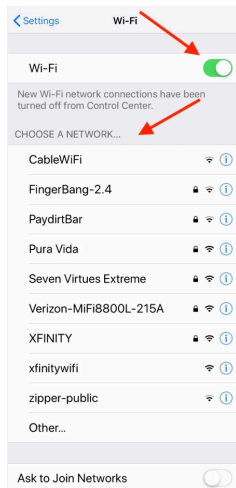
3. Tap on the Wi-Fi label.

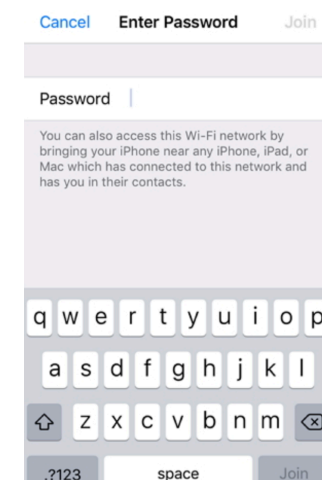
4. If the wifi tab is not green, swipe right on the tab to turn on your wifi.
5. If a network shows directly under the wifi tab with a blue check next to it, you are already connected to a wifi network.
6. If not, tap on your desired network. This will be listed under "CHOOSE A NETWORK."

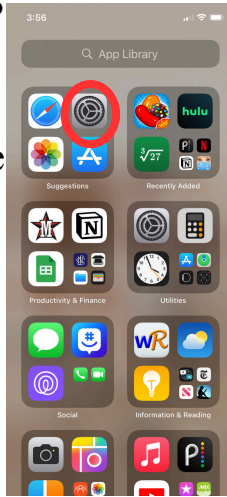
7. If the network that you have selected is private, you will be prompted to enter the wifi password after clicking the network name.
8. Enter the password, and if the password is correct, your phone will connect to the network.

Changing Wallpapers

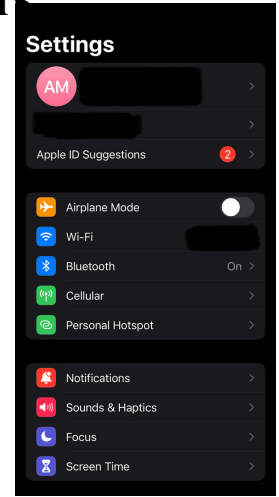
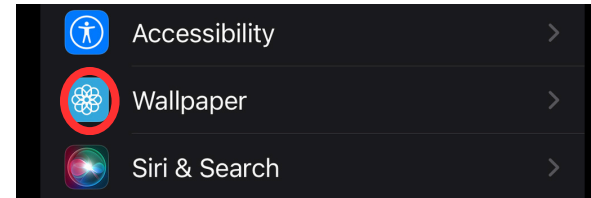
1. Changing your wallpaper means changing the image on your lock screen or your home screen to a picture of your choice.
2. Swipe right until you reach the "App Library" screen.
3. Tap on the gray settings icon or search "Settings" in the search bar and click the result.

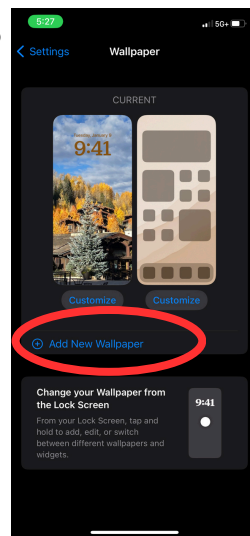
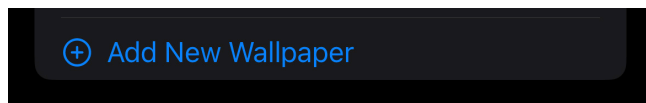
4. Scroll down in settings until you reach the label that says "Wallpapers."
5. Tap on the "Wallpapers" button.

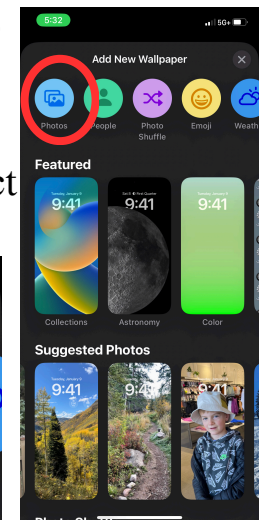
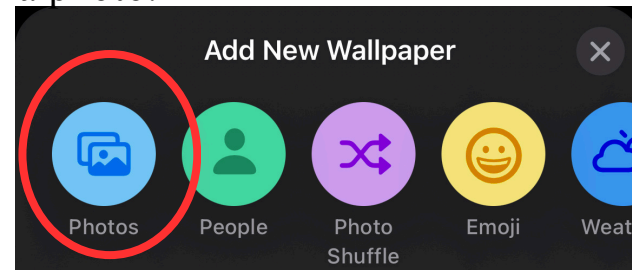
6. Tap on the "Add New Wallpaper" label.

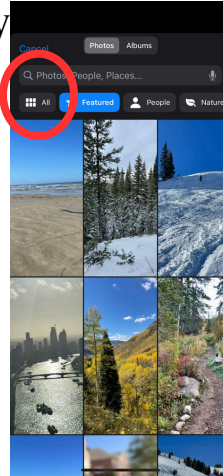
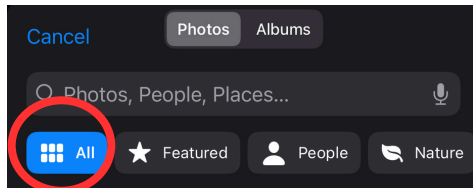
7. Click the button that says "Photos" in the top left corner. This button will open your camera roll for you to select a photo.

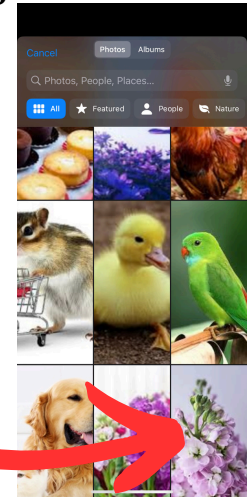
8. The camera roll will automatically open to your featured photos, so you will need to tap on the "All" button to the left of the "Featured" button in the top left corner of the screen.

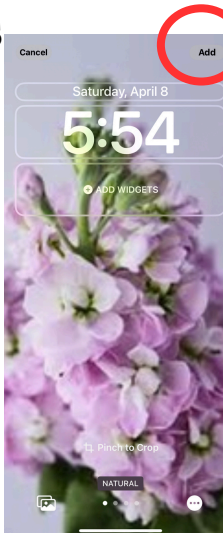
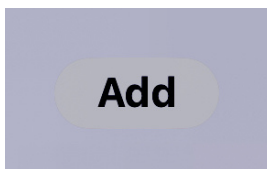
9. Scroll down through your photos until you see the image that you would like to set as your wallpaper. Then tap on this image.

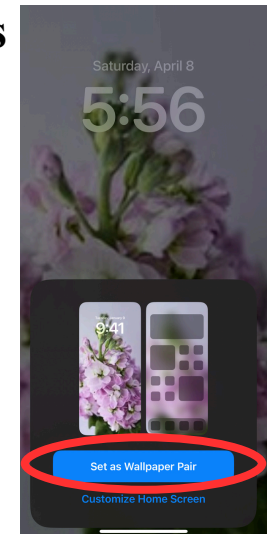
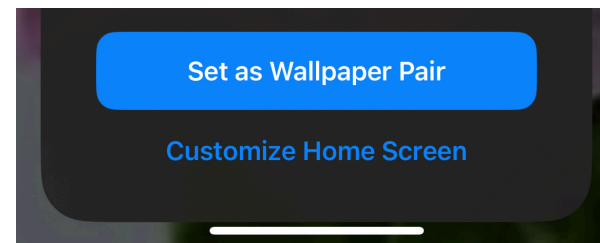
10. Now the screen will display the sample of what your wallpaper will look like. Tap "Add" in the top corner of the screen to permanently set this image as your wallpaper.

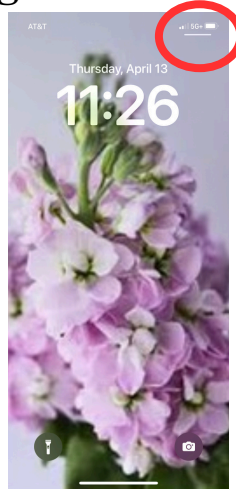

11. Click the "Set as Wallpaper Pair" button to finish setting your wallpaper.



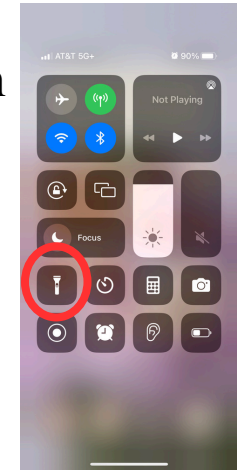
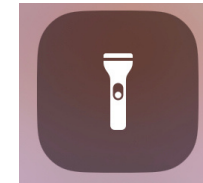
Navigating Settings on your iPhone: Using the Phone Flashlight

1. Place your finger over the battery symbol in the top right corner of the screen and drag down.

2. Press the flashlight symbol in the bottom left corner of the drop-down settings menu.



Navigating Settings on your iPhone: Silent Mode

1. Turning on silent mode will cause your phone to vibrate, instead of making noise, when you receive a message or notification on your phone.

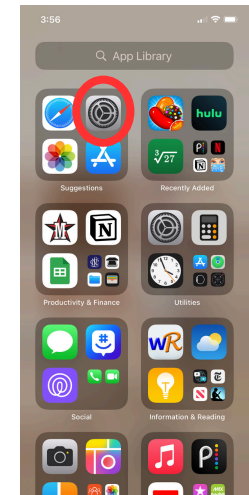
2. To turn on silent mode, turn your phone onto its left edge, and push the metal tab down until the tab is red. To turn silent mode off, push the tab up until the red goes away.

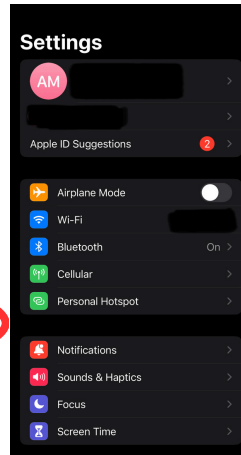
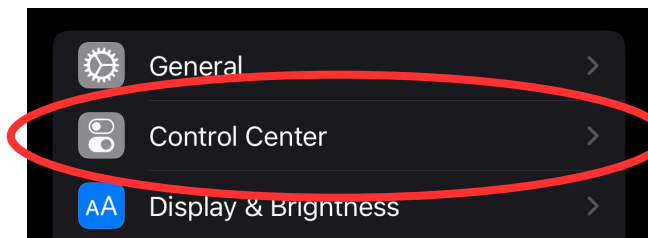
1. Swipe right on your iPhone screen until you reach the App Library screen.

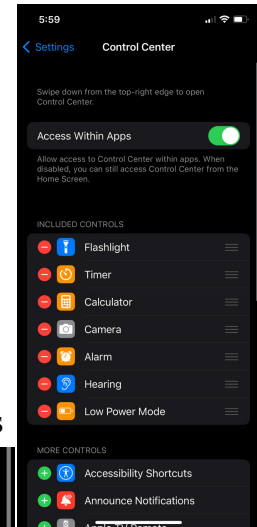
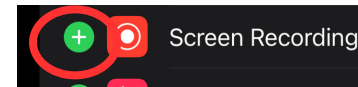
3. Scroll down until you see the "Control Center" label, and then click on this button.

4. The screen recording function is not a default control, so look through the "INCLUDED CONTROLS" section to see if the "Screen Record" label is there. If this option is included, then you can skip the next step.

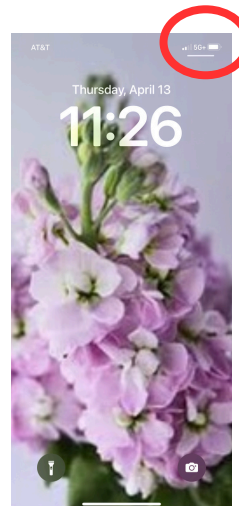
5. If you do not see the "Screen Record" label in the included controls, scroll down through the "MORE CONTROLS" section until you see the "Screen Recording" label and click the green plus symbol.

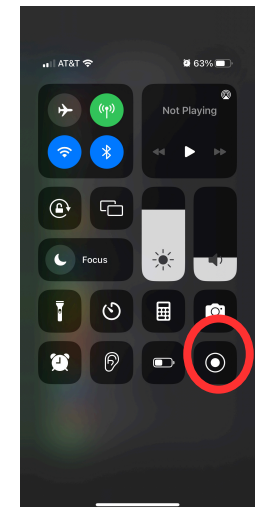
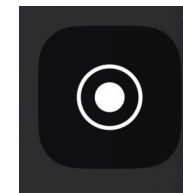
6. Now the screen recording option will show in your included control center. You can now access the function through your home screen.

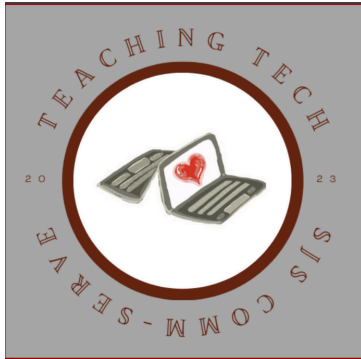
7. Place your finger over the battery symbol in the top right corner of the screen and drag down.

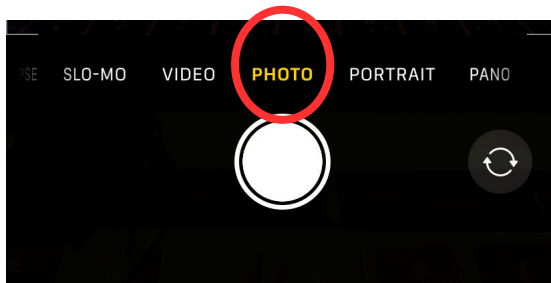
Photo Settings on your iPhone:

1. Swipe right on your iPhone screen until you reach the App Library screen.
2. Tap on the gray Camera icon on the home screen or search "Camera" in the top search bar, and click the resulting icon.



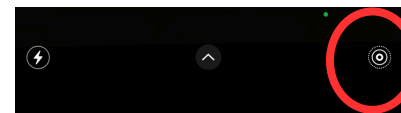
Different Camera Tools on your iPhone:

3. Make sure that your camera mode is on "Photo." To take photos, press the white button underneath



Live mode on your iPhone:

4. Live photos are photos where you can replay the moment that the photo was taken during. To take a live photo, make sure that the live mode at the top right corner of the screen is on.

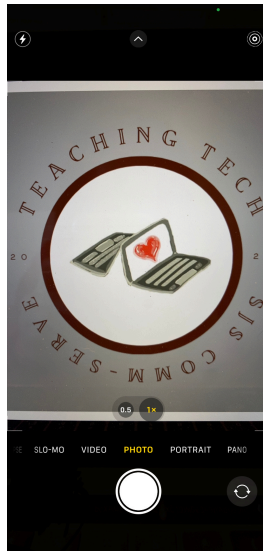
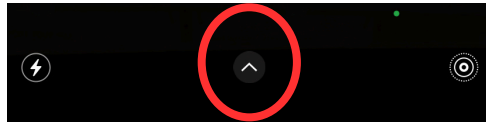

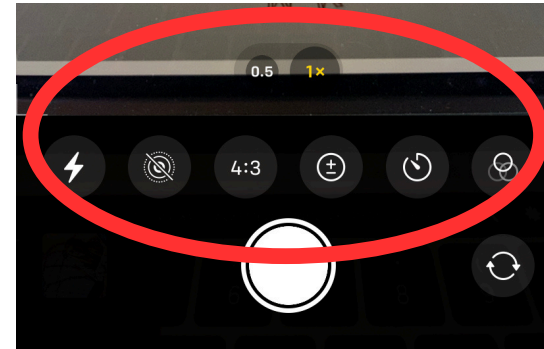
Flash Photography on your iPhone:

1. Flash photography is great for taking photos in darker lighting or when you want to have a brighter image.
2. To turn on flash, tap the upwards arrow icon at the top of your screen



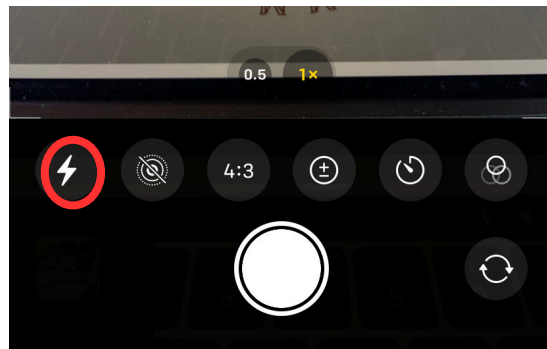
Flash Photography on your iPhone:

3. This icon will bring up a menu at the bottom of your screen.

4. Tap on the icon with the lightning bolt on the far left. This will bring up another menu for the flash feature.

6. Tap on the mode you would like to choose. Flash auto is a smart feature, where the phone is able to decide whether flash is necessary in the situation. To turn flash on and off, tap the corresponding modes in the menu
